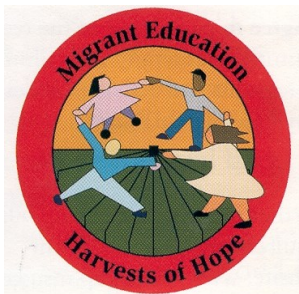

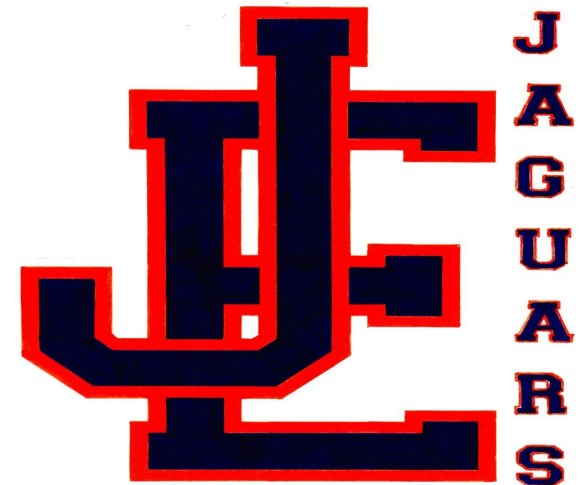

TIPS FOR MIGRANT STUDENTS

- A. If withdrawing before May 8th, migrant students are urged to attend school in a receiving district, in or out of the state, in order to obtain course credits. AP testing is May 8th thru May 19th. If students wish to take the AP exams, they must take the exams before they leave to migrate.
- B. Students should take the necessary documents:
 1. Transcript;
 2. Withdrawal Form
 3. EOC/TAKS Records
 4. Course Class Schedule
- C. If withdrawing after May 8th, migrant students must make up the work and take semester finals before withdrawing from school or lose credit for the courses.
- D. Take advantage of all the credit recovery programs available such as CTCOHSP/LATO/CBE
- E. Keep absences to a minimum
- F. Notify the migrant counselor if withdrawing from school early
- G. Join the migrant club
